FEBRUARY - SUSSEX GOSPEL PARTNERSHIP SGP Sunday 25th February

SGP is a partnership of 70 Biblecentered churches across Sussex, working together to train leaders, strengthen and plant churches, and



to advance the Gospel. Sussex Youthworks strengthens children's and young people's ministry.

Local training courses for everyday Christians, held weekly on a Tuesday and monthly on a Saturday over 2 years, give a helpful Bible overview, teach doctrine e.g. the authority of Scripture and equip participants to lead small group Bible Studies. St Margaret's is hosting a Saturday course at present!

As well as training for the leaders of the Partner churches, and ad hoc teaching days on various subjects, there is an annual conference open to all, with engaging speakers and subjects such as November 2023 -Glen Scrivener - "Unashamed - Finding confidence to talk about Jesus".

MARCH - FAMILY SUPPORT WORK FSW Sunday 10th March

Last year FSW helped over 700 families in Sussex suffering problems stemming from the cost of living, isolation, family breakdown, mental health and disabilities. Their practitioners assist



families with access to services and provide practical and emotional support, as well as help from their in-house food bank, and opportunities for trips and outings for families who would otherwise not be able to access these.

In Angmering there is now an After School Club for families in St Margaret's Church Hall on the last Wednesday each month. There was a concert in church on 9th March and will be a series of fundraising events during the spring and summer months.

The church is 11 years old, and the last 4 years or so have seen significant growth in numbers (from approx 25 to 65 on Sundays), the acquiring of their own premises (a renovation project concluding in March 2024), the appointment of a second Elder and seeing church regulars serving in various ways.

Helen is keen to encourage and equip women, including the youth, for every kind of service. She works alongside Stephen and Nikki Childs (UFM), and enjoys adventures with their 4 children so their parents can have a lie in from time to time.

MAY – AWM Arab-world Ministry of Pioneers AWM Sunday 12th May

Pioneers partners with local churches to make disciples, and initiate churchplanting among unreached peoples. The unreached are cultural and ethnic groups without a self-sustaining



witness to the gospel in their own cultures. Pioneers has 3,000+ global members who use their diverse gifts and experience to build relationships, introduce people to the Bible, share the gospel in culturally understandable ways, and make disciples who make disciples.

One Pioneers Team, for instance, works with Muslim-background believers primarily in North Africa, the Middle East, and other places with immigrant Muslim populations. They offer discipleship courses that are tailored to the cultural context and address the real challenges people from a Muslim background face in their journeys of faith. They also offer leadership training opportunities for national leaders so that they can, in turn, teach, disciple and equip others towards church multiplication. (2 Timothy 2:2)

"For years, we have looked for a program like this", a group of Arab Christians ministering to Saudi believers reported. "This is precisely what we need."
