# FEBRUARY - SUSSEX GOSPEL PARTNERSHIP SGP Sunday 23rd February

SGP is a partnership of 70 Biblecentered churches across Sussex, working together to train leaders,



strengthen and plant churches, and to advance the Gospel. Sussex Youthworks strengthens children's and young people's ministry.

Local training courses for everyday Christians, held weekly on a Tuesday and monthly on a Saturday over 2 years, give a helpful Bible overview, teach doctrine, e.g. the authority of Scripture, and equip participants to lead small group Bible Studies. St Margaret's is hosting year 2 of a monthly Saturday course; a new monthly Saturday course started in Crawley in September 2024.

As well as leaders' training, and various ad-hoc teaching days open to all, there is the annual conference with engaging speakers and subjects; in November 2024 Paul Mallard spoke on "Heaven", both wonderfull and spiritually uplifting!

Pioneers partners with local churches to make disciples, and initiate church-planting among unreached peoples, who are cultural and ethnic groups without a selfsustaining witness to the gospel.

One Pioneers Team works with Muslim-background believers primarily in North Africa, the Middle East, and places with immigrant Muslim populations; they offer discipleship courses that are tailored to the cultural context and address the real challenges people from a Muslim background face in their journeys of faith. **"For years, we have looked for a program like this"** a group of Arab Christians ministering to Saudi believers reported; **"This is precisely what we need."**  Praise the Lord for the strong relationships with local churches and believers across North Africa, the Middle East, West Africa and beyond.
Pray that through these relationships we will see new discipleship groups form, new leaders raised up and new churches planted.
Pray for the persecuted believers across the region, that amidst rejection and violence they would know the hope and love of God, live out the Gospel, grow in their faith and fearlessly proclaim Christ to others.
